

LIONS CAMP DORSET
2010 FACILITIES REPORT

The annual inspection of cottages and efficiency units was completed in November and reports are now being sent out to the sponsoring organizations.

We are pleased to report the number of outstanding issues continues to decline due to the work of Camp staff, Lions work parties and volunteers.

The past 5 years have been very busy as we embarked on an aggressive program to upgrade the efficiencies and cottages. The 15 efficiency units have been rebuilt and upgraded to make them more handicap friendly and efficient to operate and maintain.

Over the past 4 years four cottages have been rebuilt and we are now working on a fifth cottage which should be ready for occupancy early in 2011. It is our goal to continue to upgrade one cottage a year to ensure they are kept in good repair, are efficient to operate and handicap friendly where possible.

All this work has been funded by a variety of sources including donations from sponsoring Clubs, donations and support from contractors and suppliers, an excellent partnership with Corrections Canada and Camp Dorset Corporation's reserve funds.

The proposed schedule for further cottage renovations, provided funding is available, is #4, #8, #1, Dofasco, #2 and #3.

Thanks to Mississauga/Credit Valley Lions a new roof has been installed on the storage shed.

During the past year more cottages have had new energy efficient windows and doors installed.

Thanks to support from Burlington Lions the upgraded water system in the Medical Centre is functioning well and meets the current health standards.

The Board of Directors are committed to upgrading the facilities and this can only be done with the financial support of the Lions Family and dedicated volunteers.
