This years dialysis season was another success with 826 treatments being given. For the first time a group of Six Nations Cree from Moose Factory came to the Camp to receive their dialysis and enjoy the Camp and surrounding attractions.

Wifi was installed at the Camp to improve communications ability for the staff and to provide an additional service for the patients and their families.

Donations of Canadian Tire money this season was \$1,200.00 and was used for items in the Medical Centre.

Camp Manager Steve Woolman reports that the sound system in the recreation hall is being replaced which was badly needed. He also reports that Cabin 15 is undergoing a major renovation thanks to the Wasaga Beach Lions who have taken over the sponsorship of this facility and donated \$15,000.00 towards the work being done.

The Board of Directors has approved an award to recognize significant donations from a Lions Club who recognize the milestone of another Lions Club by donating to Lions Camp Dorset. Each club would get a copy of the award.
